

Canadian Centre for the Great War Opening Kicks off Remembrance Week in Montreal

New organization focused on telling the stories of Canadians role in the First World War

2 NOVEMBER 2015 – Montreal - The Canadian Centre for the Great War, a museum and archive celebrating Canada's experience in the First World War, will officially open to the public this week with a cocktail party at their Museum. The Centre, located on the Lachine Canal, houses a significant collection of First World War artefacts from Canada and around Quebec and provides guided tours and informational sessions on Fridays and Saturdays. Guests will be treated to a 'behind the scenes' tour of the storage area, meet the Centre's Director Mark Cahill and learn about its programming plans during this First World War Centennial period.

The Centre collects and preserves objects related to Canada's First World War experience and informs the public about the same.
